We are a self-funded group of families affected by Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) and professionals who support them. We advocate for FASD awareness, encouraging medical professionals to learn more about FASD and to become proactive in screening and diagnosing this disability. We provide support and resources to Maine families affected by FASD.

Leveraging our personal and professional contacts, we have launched an aggressive outreach campaign. We have attended FASD trainings through [FASD United](#), [PROOF Alliance](#), the State of Maine CDC/ DHHS, the Maine AAP, ARC of North Carolina, to name only a few. Currently, we are focused on the passage of the [FASD Respect Act S.2238, H.R. 4151](#), on enrolling Maine providers [in the HRSA funded SAFEST Choice Learning Collaborative/ FASD ECHO](#) yearlong training for clinic providers and staff, and encouraging Maine pediatricians to avail themselves of the [AAP FASD Toolkit](#).

The St. Croix Regional Family Health Center in Princeton, ME enrolled in the first cohort, starting June 2021.
- April 2021 FASD Maine and FASD United (formerly NOFAS) met with **Senator Susan Collins’** office to request her support for the bi-partisan bill, the [FASD Respect Act S.2238,H.R. 4151](#) , co-sponsored by Senators Murkowski (AK) and Klobuchar (MN).
