**FASD Maine** works to increase awareness and prevention of FASD through education of families, providers, educators, and community stakeholders. We provide resources to make services accessible to individuals and families affected by FASD. We also break down silos among stakeholders, and help to reduce the stigma associated with FASD. We do this by educating all Mainers to understand the complexities of the disability, honoring the strengths of those impacted, promoting an inclusive accepting culture.

In the past five years, FASD Maine has launched an aggressive outreach campaign. We are currently focused on the passage of the <u>FASD Respect Act</u> - federal legislation that will help meet the needs of affected individuals at the state and tribal level. We are also working to provide training to our Maine educators to learn FASD-informed practices in order to better support the 1/20 school-aged children affected by an FASD.
